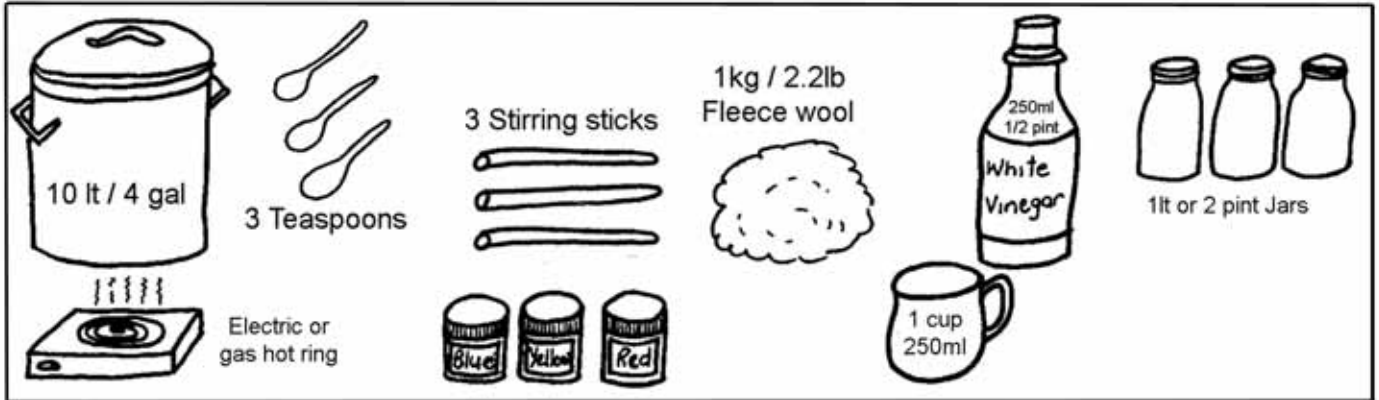


To dye 1kg / 2.2lb fleece wool you will need:



1. Add 1 measured teaspoon of dye powder to each jar.



2. Add 1/4 cup white vinegar to each jar.



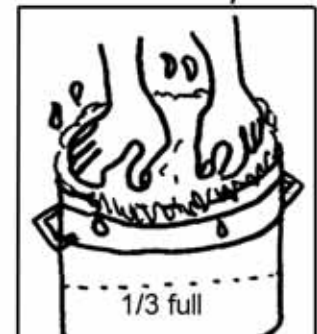
3. Add 1 cup boiling water. Stir with a stick to dissolve dye.



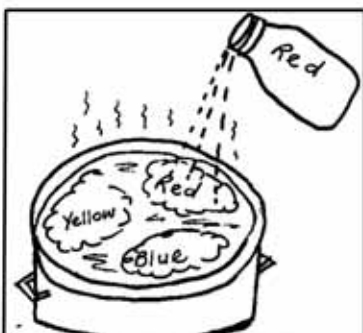
4. Fill remainder of jar with hot water. Approx. 2 cups.



5. Wash the wool with warm water & 1/4 teaspoon detergent. Rinse clean, leave wet.



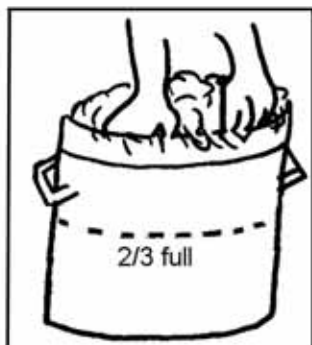
6. Put 1/3 wool in pot.



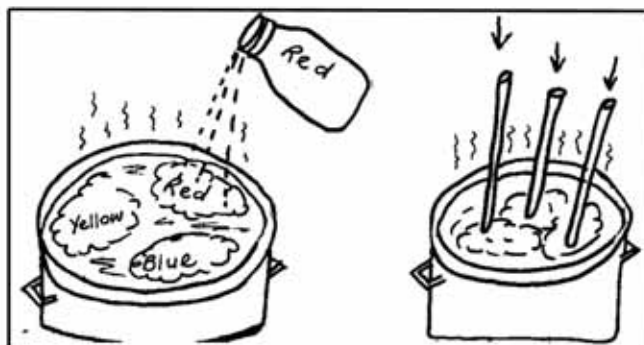
7. Pour some dye liquid in each area.



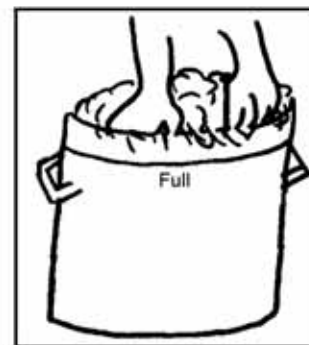
8. Press each colour area until you cannot see any white. Wool will soak up dye. **DO NOT STIR!!**



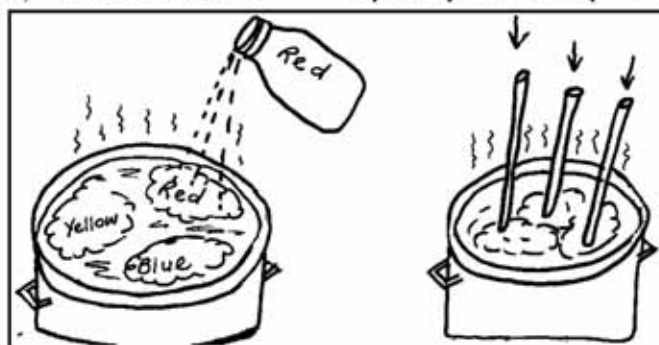
9. Add another 1/3 of the wool.



10. Repeat steps 7 & 8. Do not use too much dye liquid. Only enough to colour the wool.



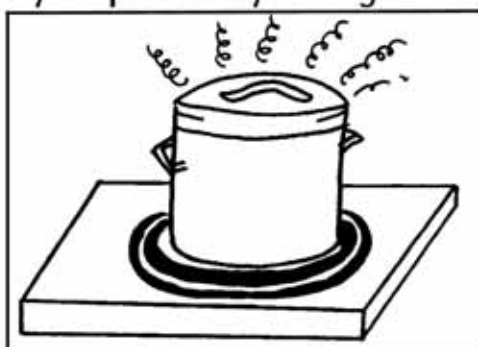
13. Add the rest of the wool.



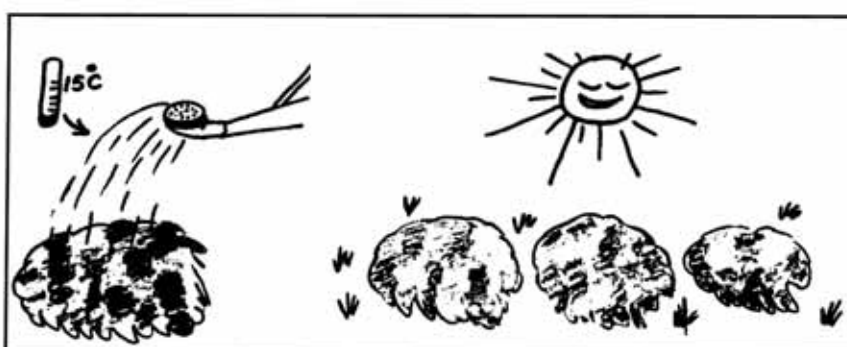
12. Repeat steps 7 & 8. Do not use too much dye liquid. Only enough to colour the wool.



11. Place lid on pot.



12. Bring to boil. Then turn down to medium heat. Cook for a maximum of 30 minutes or until the liquid is clear.



13. Drain wool, allow to cool then rinse with cold water. Spread out to dry.

**Cook slowly - bright colours - Cook fast - dark colours**

**For your safety:**

- 1) Keep dye containers tightly closed and out of children's reach.
- 2) Wear gloves.
- 3) Wear a dust mask when handling dry dye powder.
- 4) Keep dye pots and utensils for dyeing only.
- 5) Avoid breathing fumes.
