



Snuggly mohair knee rug

Light and soft, warmth without weight

You will need:

500 grams Ashford brushed mohair

Colour used: Chocolate 223

1 circular needle 6.5mm x 80cm

Finished measurement: 158cm x 59cm

Here's how:

Using the circular needle cast on 184 stitches.
(Hint: you may like to do the cast on row with a straight needle and then work onto the circular needle).

Pattern is done in basket weave. Two blocks to the pattern

Block 1:

Work the first *23 stitches in knit (plain) stitch, next 23 stitches are worked in purl*, repeat from * across the row. This will form 8 blocks of 23 stitches = 184 stitches.
Next row: Work first 23 stitches in purl, next 23 stitches in knit, repeat to end.
Work 22 rows in total. This will form the first block.

Block 2:

23rd row: Work first 23 stitches in purl, next 23 stitches in knit, repeat to end.
24th row: Work first 23 stitches in knit, next 23 stitches in purl, repeat to end.
Work 22 rows in total. This will form the second block in the pattern.

Repeat these two blocks until eight blocks in total have been knitted.
Cast off.

Make four tassels, attach to the four corners.

If you would like a more square-shaped knee rug, cast on 161 stitches, work until 9 blocks of pattern have been completed, cast off.
